### Letter from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP

We are delighted to have received a letter from the Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP (Minister of State for School Standards) congratulating us on our 2017 Key Stage 2 mathematic results. Our results showed that 100 per cent of our pupils reached or exceeded the expected standard in mathematics putting us in the top 1% of primary schools in England for attainment in mathematics.
